Significant Investigation

On May 9, 2025, at 1245 hours, Cedar Hill Officers responded to 201 E FM 1382 in reference to an Aggravated Assault. Upon arrival, officers determined the victim was involved in a verbal altercation with two unknown suspects. One of the unknown suspects used a box cutter to cut the victim's face and fled the location in a vehicle. The Criminal Investigations Division responded to the scene and reviewed video surveillance. Investigators determined the vehicle make and model of the suspect vehicle and then used the department Flock camera system to track the suspect vehicle to a Cedar Hill neighborhood. Investigators canvassed the neighborhood and located the vehicle and suspects involved. Investigators conducted interviews with the suspects and were able to identify the suspect and he was placed under arrest. Leveraging technology as a force multiplier played a key role in solving this case.
