Significant Investigation

On 6-27-2025, Cedar Hill Patrol Supervisors received a call from Flower Mound Police Department. A resident of Flower Mound reported her Kroger members account had been compromised and a fraudulent order for approximately \$500 was placed and scheduled to be picked up in Cedar Hill at 7am. The victim's Kroger account had her Discover credit card attached. Patrol Supervisors contacted CID and began setting up surveillance. While Cedar Hill officers were conducting surveillance, Detectives began gathering information from the victim and Kroger's Loss Prevention. Three suspects arrived and parked in the designated parking spot for the pick up. Cedar Hill Patrol Officers and Detectives were able to detain the three suspects. During the continuing investigation, it was found the three suspects had just picked up another fraudulent order at the Kroger's in Duncanville. The combined effort between Cedar Hill Patrol Officers and Detectives resulted in the recovery of \$1,000 in merchandise obtained by fraud. Two individuals were arrested and charged with Credit Card Abuse, a State Jail Felony.
