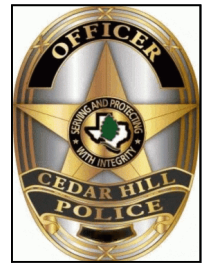

Around the Neighborhood

In July, our Police And Community Team hosted a back to school drive to benefit single parents in the community. Our officers partnered with Chick-fil-A® to host this drive and collect school supplies all month long. At the end of the month, we were able to present supplies to help fill 200 backpacks in the community.



Significant Investigation

In March 2024, Officers responded to a shooting with injury on Bailey Dr. Officers discovered a female victim suffering from a gunshot wound who was transported to the hospital. Sadly, the victim did not survive. CID responded and identified three suspects in the shooting. The suspects were later arrested within the DFW area and formally charged with murder. In July 2025, the Dallas County District Attorney's Office conducted a comprehensive review of the case, which included forensic evidence, witness statements, and investigative findings. Based on the strength of the evidence and the thoroughness of the investigation, the prosecution entered negotiations with attorneys representing each suspect. Ultimately, all three suspects chose to forgo trial and entered guilty pleas. Each defendant accepted a sentence ranging from 25 to 30 years of incarceration. These outcomes were largely attributed to the meticulous and persistent efforts of Cedar Hill detectives, whose work ensured a strong case resulting in justice for the victim and her family.
