Significant Investigation

On August 27, 2025, Cedar Hill Police Units were dispatched to the 100 block of Kenya Street in reference to a welfare check. Upon arrival, officers located an unconscious male inside a vehicle. Cedar Hill Fire Department medical personnel responded to the scene and pronounced the male deceased. The Cedar Hill Criminal Investigations Division was notified and responded to the location. After an initial assessment, detectives determined the incident to be a homicide. Detectives conducted a canvass of the surrounding area and developed several strong leads. Multiple interviews were conducted, which led to identifying the suspects involved. Within 24 hours, the Cedar Hill Criminal Investigations Division obtained and executed a search warrant, resulting in the successful apprehension of the suspects.
