Significant Investigation

On 09-24-2025, the Cedar Hill Police Department received reports of vehicle burglaries occurring in the Cedar Hill East neighborhood around the 400 block of Hastings Drive. Investigators obtained video surveillance evidence from a resident in the area. While viewing the video evidence, investigators assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division were able to positively identify the suspect as a known vehicle burglar and habitual offender. Investigators obtained a felony warrant of arrest for the offender who was arrested in the following weeks. The offender was interviewed and admitted to the offenses. Investigators are working with the Offender in attempt to identify additional vehicle burglary offenses that occurred in the Cedar Hill East and Highlands neighborhoods.
